 - The LEED is recognized as the national standard for sustainable "green" building. LEED is targeted the top tier of sustainable homes, those projects that are truly leading the way with Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED)!

 - There are less that two dozen LEED APs registered with the Green Building Certification Institute as code officials or in city and county planning departments. Pima county's commitment to the principles of green building is evidenced by the fact that six of these are employees of Building Safety and Sustainability.
