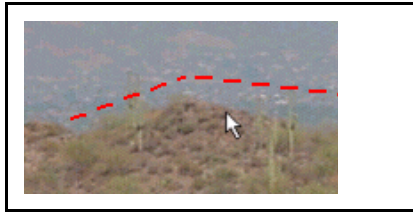
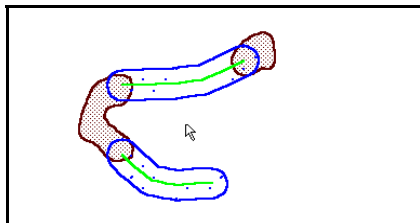


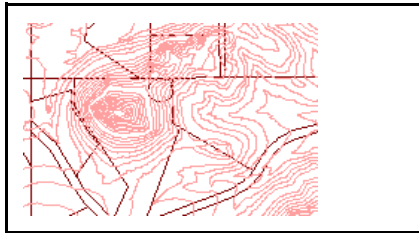
Peaks and Ridges Display/Recommendation Legend



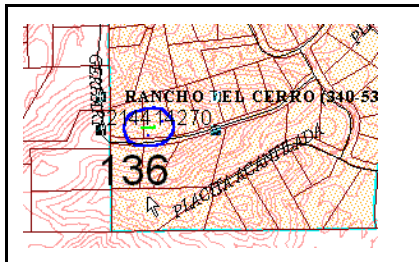
Red hash line in photo indicates outline of the feature in contrast to the background of the photo. Typically, the red line is placed just about the feature's silhouette. The white arrow in the photo also points out the feature.



The blue shapes in the maps indicate a proposed peak or ridge. The green line inside the blue shape represents the proposed ridge line. The brown shapes indicate a historically protected peak or ridge.



The solid maroon lines in the maps indicate parcel boundaries. The pink, red, or green contour lines indicate the 10' topography contours (DTM/DEM derived).



The large/bold number is the assigned peak or ridge number. The smaller 9 digit number is a tax code number of an impacted lot. The tax number (if presented) is an reference for location. The beige color indicates a recorded subdivision. Streets and subdivisions are labeled accordingly.
